1 Chairperson's Statement

We continued to have blended (in-person plus online) meetings in 2023 – this particularly suits those members outside of Dublin and will be the new normal.

With the development of a new revision of the general systems requirements document in CEN/CENELEC, NSAI/ETC/TC 13 will be entering a period of standards change and challenges not seen since the late 1990s. The emphasis will be towards better cyber security.

With the rollout of An Garda Síochána's computer-aided dispatch system we will be reviewing S.R. 25:2005 (Alarm Receiving Centres Alarm Handling Procedures).

2 Introduction

NSAI/ETC/TC 13 was established as a National Mirror Committee to mirror the work of the European standards committee CENELEC TC 79 "Alarm systems" and the international standards committee IEC TC 79 "Alarm systems".

Alarm systems encompass detection, signalling, and monitoring systems for the protection of persons and property, including elements used in such systems. The scope includes, in particular, intruder and hold-up alarm systems, access control systems, periphery protection systems, combined alarm and fire alarm systems, social alarm systems, CCTV systems, and other monitoring and surveillance systems related to security applications, as well as associated and dedicated transmission and communication systems. The Technical Specifications and Standards also detail methods and tests for compatibility assessment of system components.

3 Scope of TC

The scope of NSAI/ETC/TC 13 is to follow and contribute to the work of CENELEC TC 79 and to follow the work of IEC TC 79.

NSAI/ETC/TC 13 is also tasked with the review of some Irish Standard Recommendations -

- S.R. 25:2005 (Alarm Handling and Verification) under review
- S.R. 45:2013 (Remote monitoring of CCTV systems) under review

- Working Group 2 S.R. 45:2013+A1:2014 (Remote monitoring of CCTV systems).

The NMCF (National Monitoring Centre Forum) have spent some time reviewing both S.R. 45 and PSA 2006_12 together. The PSA will also be conducting a review of S.R. 45 taking into account this NMCF review and NSAI discussions.

The committee will continue to meet twice per year.




Figure 1 – Alarm Monitoring Centre
