2 Introduction

The Fire Safety Standards Committee (FSSC) is the committee that steers Fire Safety Standardization. The FSSC advise on what standards and codes of practice are necessary for products and processes in all aspects of fire safety.

3 Scope of TC

- To advise the NSAI with regard to Irish Standards and Codes of Practice concerning all aspects of fire safety including Passive Fire Protection, Active Fire Protection, Fire Service Equipment and Fire Safety of Furniture & Fittings and to make recommendations as required.
- To draft appropriate documentation including Standards, Codes of Practice, and Amendments as necessary.
- To ensure that interested parties are consulted in the drafting of these standards and codes of practice.
- To liaise with similar bodies in other EU countries and in particular CEN (European Committee for Standardisation) and ISO (International Organisation for Standardisation).
- To advise NSAI on how to vote on draft European and International Standards in the area of fire safety.

4 Structure and Membership

4.1 Structure

The FSSC has set up a number of Working Groups to deal with specific areas of Fire Safety. These groups have a Chairman and develop standards and recommend voting positions on International Standards. The groups report back to the FSSC at regular intervals and advise the FSSC on current developments

The working groups are:

- Fire Safety in Buildings (Standby)
- Fire Alarms
- Fire Services Equipment
- Fire Safety of Furniture & Textiles (Standby)
- Emergency Lighting

In addition, working groups 2, 3 and 5 met on a number of occasions (approx. 20 meetings total) to progress the development of Irish Standards they are responsible for.

5.1.2 National Work

Each of the FSSC working Groups has a Chairperson and some develop standards. National work items in 2021 included;

- 4th edition of I.S. 3218 Fire detection and alarm systems for buildings System design, installation, servicing and maintenance
- 4th edition of I.S. 3217 Code of Practice for Emergency Lighting
- Amendment No. 1 to I.S. 291:2015 Selection, commissioning, installation, inspection and maintenance of portable fire extinguishers

5.2.2 International/Regional Work

Each FSSC working group recommend voting positions on International Standards in their respective fields. Within the active working groups there is strong engagement with our international counterparts.

Documents published in 2021 that included direct input from Irish experts included;

• EN 3-8:2021 - Portable fire extinguishers - Part 8: Requirements for the construction, pressure resistance and mechanical tests for extinguishers with a maximum allowable pressure equal to or lower than 30 bar, which comply with the requirements of EN 3-7

5.2.3 International/Regional Standards Reviewed

International Standards reviewed by the various working groups are too numerous to list. Documents of high importance are as follows;

- EN 3 Series of Standards on Portable Fire Extinguishers
- EN 54 Series of Standards on Fire Detection and Fire Alarm Systems
- EN 1838 Lighting applications Emergency lighting
- EN 50172 Emergency escape lighting systems
- EN 12845 series of Standards on Automatic Sprinkler Systems

5.2.4 International/Regional Voting Results

International and regional committees mirrored by FSSC working groups launched approx. 130 ballots in 2021. NSAI actively voted on approx. 7% of these ballots.

5.3 Regulatory Development/Update

The FSSC maintains a close relationship with the Dept. of Housing, Local Government, and Heritage (DHLGH). The DHLGH is responsible for the development of the Technical Guidance Document B on Fire Safety.

A meeting between the DHLGH and NSAI took place in September 2021. The intent of this meeting is to ensure there is a forum for bilateral exchange of information between both organisations. This meeting typically occurs twice annually.

At the request of DHLGH, NSAI facilitated the contribution of pre-consultation phase comments from members of NSAI fire safety technical bodies, during the drafting phase of TGD B . It is expected that committees will comment formally when the public comment commences.
